The Catholic Church has **four marks** by which it may be known: it is One, it is Holy, it is Catholic and it is Apostolic.

Apostonic.

Note: A mark is a given and known sign by which a thing can be distinguished from all others of its kind.

One - because her members have to believe all the same Sacred Divine Truths contained in the Creed, they are all bound by the same Commandments of GOD and of the Church, they all have recourse to the same means of Divine Worship and grace with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the Sacraments and prayer and are under one head JESUS CHRIST and by virtue of Him, His vicar on earth, the visible head, the Pope.

Holy - because her founder, JESUS CHRIST is holy, His holy Doctrine is her Doctrine, her Sacraments are holy, she offers to all the means of holiness, and because of the holiness of so many of her members of different ages. **Catholic** (universal) - because she has all the Divinely revealed truths of GOD, she has the authority from JESUS CHRIST to teach all nations, and she exists in all ages.

Apostolic - Because she was founded by JESUS CHRIST on His Apostles and has come down directly from them through the uninterrupted succession of her bishops and because she received from the Apostles of JESUS CHRIST, who alone could give them, her doctrine, her orders, and her mission.

•November is the Month of the Holy Souls, a time when Catholics are especially encouraged to pray for the faithful departed, particularly those in purgatory.

This devotion is rooted in the belief that our prayers, sacrifices, and Masses can aid the souls undergoing purification on their way to heaven.

The month invites reflection on the Four Last Things—death, judgment, heaven, and hell. Despite its somber tone, November is ultimately a month of hope, rooted in Christ's victory over death and the promise of eternal life. The Church Militant (on earth), Suffering (in purgatory), and Triumphant (in heaven) are especially united in prayer during this time.

- •Indulgences for the Dead: From November 1–8, Catholics can gain a plenary indulgence for a soul in purgatory by visiting a cemetery and praying for the dead, under the usual conditions.
- •Offering Masses: Attending or requesting Masses for deceased loved ones is a powerful act of charity. **Daily prayers**: The *Eternal Rest* prayer ("Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord...") is often recited throughout the month.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* defines an indulgence as "a remission before God of the **temporal punishment due to sins** whose guilt has already been forgiven" (CCC 1471).

To pray for the souls in Purgatory while visiting a cemetery, the most common prayer is the "Eternal Rest" prayer.
