Second Sunday In Ordinary Time ~ January 18, 2026

Ordinary Time began Monday last

Ordinary Time is one of those phrases that sounds far less beautiful than what it actually means. In the Church's liturgical life, nothing is ever "ordinary" in the sense of dull or unimportant. Ordinary Time is, in fact, the season in which the extraordinary mystery of Christ quietly permeates the daily rhythm of Christian life.

What Ordinary Time Actually Is

Ordinary Time refers to the weeks of the liturgical year that fall **outside** the major seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. It is divided into two segments:

- **From the Monday after the Baptism of the Lord until the day before Ash Wednesday**
- **From the Monday after Pentecost until the First Sunday of Advent**

These weeks are numbered—*ordinal* weeks—hence the name "Ordinary."

What is the Apostolic Pardon?

The **Apostolic Pardon** is a special blessing the Church gives to someone who is near death. It is usually offered by a priest after the Anointing of the Sick. It is not magic, and it is not a "ticket to heaven," but it is one of the most beautiful expressions of the Church's mercy.

What does it do?

The Apostolic Pardon grants a **plenary indulgence** — the complete remission of all *temporal punishment* due to sin.

To understand that, we need to recall two effects of sin:

- **Guilt** — forgiven through Confession or perfect contrition
- **Temporal punishment** — the lingering effects of sin that require purification (normally in purgatory)

The Apostolic Pardon removes **all** temporal punishment, provided the person is properly disposed and in the state of grace.

National Eucharistic Launches Journey in St. Augustine

St. Augustine will serve as the starting point for the 2026 National Eucharistic Pilgrimage as Catholics across the country prepare to mark America's 250th anniversary through prayer, worship and public witness. The pilgrimage will begin Memorial Day weekend with Mass at the National Shrine of Our Lady of La Leche, the site of the first Mass celebrated in what is now the United States. Bishop Erik Pohlmeier said launching the pilgrimage in St. Augustine highlights the deep roots of Catholic faith that developed alongside the nation and calls the Church to carry the Gospel forward with hope


