What are the precepts of the Catholic Church?

The Church keeps this list beautifully simple. The *Precepts of the Catholic Church* are the “indispensable minimum” of prayer, sacramental life, and moral effort expected of every Catholic. They’re drawn directly from the Catechism and echoed consistently across reliable sources.

The Five Precepts of the Church

Grounded in the Catechism of the Catholic Church and summarized clearly by pastoral resources:

1. Attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation

Participate in the Eucharistic celebration when the Church gathers.

2. Confess your sins at least once a year

This ensures ongoing conversion and reconciliation with God and the Church.

3. Receive Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter season

This is sometimes called the “Easter Duty.”

4. Observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church

These practices unite us to Christ’s sacrifice and discipline our hearts.

5. Provide for the material needs of the Church

Each according to one’s ability, supporting the mission and life of the Church.

The Franciscan Friars Minor announced the proclamation in a Jan. 10 press release, stating that during this Jubilee year “the Christian faithful are invited to follow the example of the Saint of Assisi, becoming models of holiness of life and constant witnesses of peace.”

The Blessed Sacrament is Exposed every Tuesday from 6-7pm for your quiet prayer time. Come make a visit! Confessions available.


