Don't forget your guardian angel!

Although most of us will never see our guardian angels, many saints have. Padre Pio frequently conversed with his guardian angel, who would defend him against demonic attacks. Gemma Galgani was in daily contact with her guardian angel, who taught, protected, and corrected her. Sr. Faustina Kowalska spoke of her guardian angel accompanying her on her journeys. We should dispel the romantic and "cute" notion that guardian angels are only relevant for vulnerable children. We, too, can converse with and be assured of our guardian angel's protecting and guiding presence.

This Memorial Day weekend, the National Shrine of Our Lady of La Leche will become the starting point for a historic journey of faith.

As the United States approaches its 250th anniversary, the **2026 National Eucharistic Pilgrimage** will begin in St. Augustine, linking the earliest chapter of Catholic life in this land with a new generation of pilgrims carrying the Eucharist across the country.

Pilgrims will gather at Mission Nombre de Dios May 22–25 for prayer, liturgies and special events before the journey begins. From St. Augustine, the Blessed Sacrament will travel north along the Eastern Seaboard, eventually concluding in Philadelphia around Independence Day.

The pilgrimage follows the St. Frances Xavier Cabrini Route and is part of the National Eucharistic Revival. A small group of young adult pilgrims will accompany the Blessed Sacrament along the entire route, participating in Mass, Eucharistic adoration and processions in dioceses across the country.

Launching the pilgrimage in St. Augustine highlights the deep Catholic roots of the city. In 1565, Father Francisco Lopez de Mendoza Grajales celebrated a Mass of thanksgiving as Spanish settlers established what became the first permanent European settlement in what is now the United States.

It is fitting that this pilgrimage begins where the Catholic faith first took root in this land, Bishop Erik Pohlmeier said. The Eucharist has been present here since the earliest days of this community.

The Shrine will host several events throughout the weekend as pilgrims gather to pray and prepare for the journey.

The Blessed Sacrament is Exposed every Tuesday evening from 6-7pm for your quiet prayer time. Confessions available.
