Catechism on SIN

16. What is the difference between temptation and sin? Temptation is a strong inclination or suggestion to sin which may come from the devil, from something outside us, or from our tendency toward evil as a result of Adam's fall. Sin is knowingly and willingly breaking the law of God, not merely the inclination to commit evil.

17. Can temptation always be resisted? Temptation can always be resisted because God will not allow us to be tempted beyond our strength.

18. What is mortal sin; what three elements are necessary to it? Mortal sin is a grievous offense against the law of God that deprives us of grace and leads to eternal death in hell. The three elements necessary to make a mortal sin are: First, the thought, desire, word, action or omission must be seriously wrong or considered seriously wrong; Second, the sinner must be mindful of the serious wrong; Third, the sinner must fully consent to it.

19. What is venial sin; What makes up venial sin? Venial sin is a less serious offense against the law of God, which does not deprive the soul of sanctifying grace, and which can be pardoned even without sacramental confession. There are two conditions that make up a venial sin: First, when the evil done is not seriously wrong; second, when the evil done is indeed seriously wrong, but the sinner sincerely (but falsely) believes it is only slightly wrong, or when he does not give full consent to it.

20. What are the occasions of sin? What are the near occasions of sin? The occasion of sin is any person, place or thing which may lead us into sin. The near occasions of sin are all persons, places, or things that may likely lead us into sin.

21. What are the main sources of the sins people commit? The main sources of the sins people commit are the seven capital sins: pride, avarice, envy, anger, lust, gluttony, and sloth.

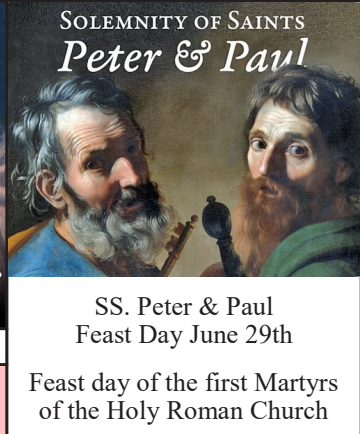
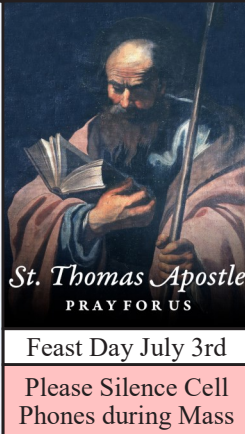
