In the **Catholic Church**, the month of **August** is dedicated to the **Immaculate Heart of Mary**. Throughout the centuries numerous saints have held a deep devotion to the Immaculate Heart — often referred to as the Sacred Heart of Mary until Our Lady's apparition at Fatima. Among the saints most devoted to this pure Heart are St. John Eudes, St. Louis de Monfort, The Children of Fatima, and St. Maximilian Kolbe.

St. Charbel on Protecting the Family

St. Charbel teaches that the devil's primary battleground is the family. Because the family reflects God's own image and is the foundation of His plan, the Evil One relentlessly tries to fracture it. We can see this clearly in today's culture, where families are increasingly divided and overwhelmed.

To guard the home, St. Charbel urges families to keep God at the center. Protection comes through prayer, honest conversation, mutual understanding, forgiveness, and—above all—deep listening. He invites us to listen not only with our ears, but with our eyes, our hearts, our words, and even our actions.

He warns that the "noise of the world" can rush into a home like a storm, scattering peace and unity. Even though he lived in the 19th century, his insight is strikingly relevant today, when constant digital noise makes silence almost impossible. And yet, silence is precisely what the family needs to heal.

St. Charbel reminds us that nothing in the world can replace the warmth of a united family. If we intentionally cultivate listening, reduce the noise that invades our homes, and foster forgiveness and dialogue, our families will rest securely in God's protective embrace..

The Transfiguration of the Lord

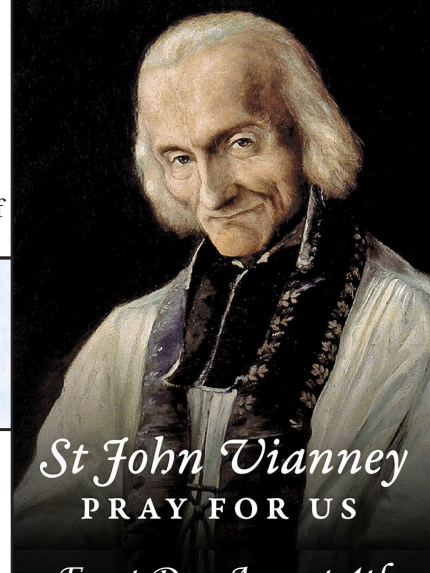
