September's Dedication to Our Lady of Sorrows

The Catholic Church dedicates the month of **September** to **Our Lady of Sorrows** because her principal feast, the **Feast of the Seven Sorrows of Mary**, is celebrated on **September 15**. This placement follows the **Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross** on September 14, which honors Christ's victory over sin and death, and immediately invites the faithful to reflect on Mary's faithful presence at the foot of the Cross.

Origins of the Devotion

The devotion to Mary's sorrows dates back to the **12th century**, inspired by saints like **St. Anselm** and **St. Bernard of Clairvaux**. The **Cistercian** and later the **Servite Order** promoted it, and by **1423**, a council in Mainz established the Feast of the Sorrows of Mary. Pope Benedict XIII added it to the Roman Calendar in 1727, ensuring its universal observance.

The Seven Sorrows of Mary

These are the key events in Mary's life that caused her profound sorrow:

1. **Simeon's Prophecy** – Luke 2:34–35: "A sword will pierce your own soul."
2. **Flight into Egypt** – Matthew 2:13–14.
3. **Loss of the Child in the Temple** – Luke 2:41–51.
4. **Meeting Jesus on the Way to Calvary** – Luke 23:26–31.
5. **St. John at the Cross** – John 19:25–27.
6. **Receiving the Body of Jesus** – John 19:38
7. **Burial of Jesus** – John 19:39–42

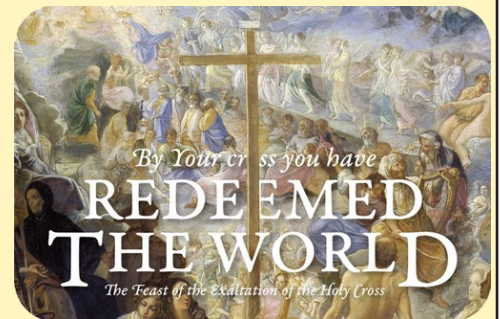
